MINUTES OF THE NORTH HORSHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON-LINE ON THURSDAY 4TH MARCH 2021 COMMENCING AT 7.30pm

FC/557/21 Public Forum.

There were three members of the public in attendance.

FC/558/21 Apologies for absence.

Apologies for absence were received from Cllr R Ginn and Cllr T Rickett. B.E.M.

Cllr I Wassell extended his apologies as he couldn't stay for the full meeting.

Following a request from Cllr Rickett B.E.M. the Council RESOLVED to accept his apologies for absence until 31st July 2021 due to family caring commitments.

Cllr D Mahon joined the meeting.

FC/559/21 Minutes of the previous meetings.

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 14th January 2021 and the Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting held on 22nd February 2021 were **AGREED** and will be signed by the Chairman as a true record.

FC/560/21 Declarations of interest.

There were no Declarations of Interest.

With the agreement of the Council the meeting was adjourned to allow Mr

M Kitching from SK Transport Planning Ltd. to speak on an idea to use a footpath between Earles Meadow and Whitehorse Road/ Amberley Road, on parish council land as part of an enhanced cycle infrastructure in North Horsham.

Residents and councillors were invited to put questions and concerns to Mr Kitching.

The agenda item relating to this matter was brought forward.

Cllr Cornell joined during this item.

FC/561/21 Footpath between Earles Meadow and Whitehorse Road/ Amberley Road

SK Transport Planning Ltd. is working with West Sussex County Council (WSCC) to provide enhanced local cycleways in North Horsham and had identified the footpath between Earles Meadow and Whitehorse Road/ Amberley Road for potential improvement. It was suggested that an additional cycle path was constructed adjacent to or closely following the existing pathway.

Residents voiced their concerns as the pathway is well used by pedestrians of all ages and by some people with mobility issues.

Mixing pedestrians and cyclists would pose a serious risk of accidents. Residents were puzzled as to who would use the cycle path as it only leads to and from Earles Meadow.

The road network from Earles Meadow already has significant challenges with a blind bend and speeding traffic coming from the Moorhead roundabout. Adding cyclists into the situation would be a safety risk. It was suggested that focus should be given to enhancing cycle ways from Horsham to the bridge that will be constructed over the A264 to the development north of Horsham and which links with existing cycleways. A recently completed Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) originated by Horsham District Council (HDC) had not highlighted any need for improved cycling infrastructure in this area. It was recommended that WSCC should speak to the Project Engineer at HDC who was working on the LCWIP.

The proposed cycle path would be paid for by money identified in a Section 106 contribution from development north of Horsham and there was provision for maintenance over 15 to 20 years.

The Chairman expressed regret that the Parish Council hadn't been notified about the proposal earlier in the process.

Mr Kitching thanked those that had contributed to the discussion and indicated that he would make sure that WSCC was aware of the comments.

No decision was made on the footpath but it was AGREED that if WSCC wanted to speak with the Parish Council in the future there would be

an opportunity to do so.

Two members of the public left the meeting along with Cllr Wassell.

FC/561/21 Decisions made by delegated power since 14th January 2021 for ratification.

The Council NOTED that following the Prime Minister's announcement on 22nd February 2021 outlining the timetable for the 'roadmap to recovery', which will guide easing of lockdown as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic (Covid 19), the arrangements for staff working reduced hours (with the exception of the Clerk who has had agreement to reduce her hours further) will continue to the end of March 2021 when they will be reviewed.

FC/562/21 Committees and Working Parties.

The following Committee Minutes were presented to the Council :-

- (a) Personnel Committee held on 4th February 2021.
- (b) Planning, Environment and Transport Committee Meetings held on 28th January 2021 and 25th February 2021.
- (c) Property Committee Meeting held on 18th February 2021. It was RESOLVED that the Committee Minutes listed above be received and adopted.

FC/563/21 Reports from representatives on outside bodies.

Cllr Searle advised the Council that Britaniacrest Recycling had suspended their liaison meetings since the start of the pandemic, but there is an online meeting scheduled for 30th March 2021 which will include a progress report on the Recycling, Recovery and Renewable Energy Facility (3Rs) on Langhurstwood Road.

It was RESOLVED to note information supplied by representatives on outside bodies.

FC/564/21 Reports from District or County Councillors.

West Sussex County Councillor Peter Catchpole and Horsham District Councillor John Milne had given apologies.

West Sussex County Councillor Liz Kitchen advised that she would not be standing in the forthcoming County elections. She reminded councillors that the 10 week consultation on Children and Young People Services reported at the last Parish Council Meeting, opened on 8th March 2021.

Cllr Andrew Baldwin noted that there would be brief roadworks on the roundabout at the junction of Parsonage Road and Kings Road.

Booking will be required at amenity tips in Worthing, Crawley, Littlehampton, Bognor Regis and Hop Oast, Horsham from 29th March 2021. This is to reduce the number of people on site for health and safety reasons. At Hop Oast, cars are often queued onto the main road causing an obstruction. This situation is exacerbated by limited opening hours.

West Sussex County Cllrs Baldwin and Kitchen left the meeting.

FC/565/21 Report from the North Horsham Community Land Trust (NHCLT) link councillor.

The Chairman of the NHCLT, Cllr J Gough, informed the Parish Council that there is an annual general meeting on 18th March 2021 required by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). Members have bought shares and there has been a donation of £200. A bank account has been opened and research continues to find empty properties suitable for conversion or infill sites.

FC/565/21 Chairman's announcements.

There were no Chairman's announcements.

FC/566/21 Financial Matters.

The Finance Report to 31st January 2021 and the expenditure lists for January 2021 and February 2021 (provisional) are attached at Appendix 1. **The Parish Council RESOLVED:-**

- 1. To note the Financial Report to 31st January 2021 with attachments.
- 2. To agree the final expenditure lists for January 2021 28,584.02 and £28,074.03 for February 2021 (provisional).

FC/567/21 Annual Parish Council Meeting and Annual Meeting of the Electors of the Parish.

The Council AGREED to re-schedule the Annual Parish Council Meeting from 6th May 2021 to 15th May 2021 to avoid elections.

The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 ("the 2020 Regulations") came in to force on 4 April and will last until 7th May 2021. Broadly speaking, the 2020 Regulations enable local councils to hold remote meetings (including by video and telephone conferencing) and remove the requirement to hold an annual meeting (Annual Meeting of the Electors of the Parish). It is not clear whether the legislation will be extended.

The Local Government Act 1972 s9(1) indicates that a Parish must hold

an annual meeting of electors between 1st March and 1st June inclusive, however there is no obligation for the Parish Council to convene the meeting unless it is required to in standing orders. There is no effective method of enforcing the rules either.

It was RESOLVED to defer the Annual Meeting of the Electors of the Parish scheduled for 26th April 2021 to later in the year when face to face meetings were allowed.

FC/568/21 Street naming for the development north of Horsham

The Council RESOLVED to submit to HDC a suggestion for naming streets in North Horsham on the theme of castles and creatures, plants or trees not already in use in Horsham. The Council suggested a list of street names, put forward by Cllr Wilton and they too will be submitted to HDC. (Appendix 2)

The last member of the public left during this item.

FC/569/21 Membership of the West Sussex Association of Local Councils

Cllr Mahon gave an update following the WSALC AGM on 25th February 2021 (Appendix 3).

It was RESOLVED that any invoice received from WSALC Ltd is not paid until the Parish Council has had the opportunity to consider all options available to them.

FC/570/21 Correspondence.

Income

Whilst income over the first ten months of the year is significantly lower than expected, it exceeds the amount put into the forecast for the 2021/22 budget. Any additional income offsets the estimated deficit of £23,187 for this financial year.

Expenditure

Expenditure to 31st January 2021 is significantly lower than the estimated £435,485 forecast for the 2021/22 budget. There is still some maintenance to be carried out during February and March, but only essential work and work associated with Health and Safety is being carried out.

Summary

The budget and precept put forward for 2021/22 takes into account the careful management of funds over this financial year and it is possible that the predicted deficit of £23,187 for 2020/21 could be reduced as income is higher and expenditure lower than predicted.

Reserves

At the 31st January 2021, there is £237,866 in Ear Marked Reserves and a General Reserve of £307,823.

APPENDIX 3

Dear Councillors and colleagues

The West Sussex Association of Local Councils (WSALC) had its AGM on the 25 February with approximately 150 voting members in attendance. The Clerk advised you of the key voting outcomes which were all in line with the Councils recommendations to our representatives.

So where do we go from here?

We at North Horsham can follow our own path should we wish to (it is a Federal system) or we can influence the revival of a West Sussex and perhaps a Sussex Association to provide first class services to its members. It is not a journey without obstacles, but it is one I recommend to you after consideration.

Some pre Reading to help your understanding might be 1 AGM minutes 25 February – focus on Agenda item 6 and 9.2 ordinary resolution at the very end – All reference Directors resignations, nominations, and de-selection. 2 A short paper by 4 Parish chairs (Messrs Denham, Beaton, Shaxson and Steer ex WSALC director) on their view of the way forward – something to consider. Both were issued by the Clerk over the last week.

WSALC Board

They (WSALC) have some short-term issues to address before any long-term plans or a new strategy can be brought into being.

Currently we have a fractured board with probably no permanent chairman, yet appointed, brand new members, vacancies and existing board members expecting to be de-selected by their local associations within the next two weeks.

They had a board meeting on the 02 March and have a further one planned for 11 March . Key decision that day is Service Prison post 31 March! — See below

There has been a call for a WSALC General Meeting by WSALC board member Tony Nicklen. I would expect the Chairs meeting on the 9 March to consider the virtues of that proposal.

SSALC Board

There appears to be no way of saving the corporate body after is dissolution on the 31^{st of} March.

Now that may be no bad thing as it was only a Shell company used as an employment vehicle, to buy and sell services and collect fees. Bringing the decision making and management closer to home may be valuable and the staff who had the "Value" are now elsewhere (see below)

HALC

The chair of West Sussex, Terry Oliver is also the chair of Horsham Association of Local Councils. Mr Baxter is also a board member of both. I am personally not aware, but I would expect the Chair and / or The Clerk to be advised of a special meeting soon to consider the Horsham response to the future of WSALC and services provision.

NALC

The overall National Association of Local Councils body accepts members and provides services to Parish / Town council members through their County Membership. Not a member of a County? No Services!

Service Provision

The first stage is to set in place Services for fair prices that Parish and Town Councils can use and have confidence in immediately. This business is about people and luckily most of the previous SSALC staff are available, albeit with a different hat on.

Mark Mulberry was a Director and Company Secretary of WSALC and SSALC until very recently. He can provide the Company Law support and through his company to provide employment for the likes of Trevor Leggo (CEO SSALC) to provide his guidance and advice.

East Sussex are employing Trevor for two days a week and as per the AGM resolution contact has been made with both boards to consider future co-operation models. It is NOT a given that East Sussex will join with us after what WSALC has put the Counties through. Trust must be earned and may take a little time.

Surrey have set about on their own road and Anne Bott is their new CEO, although I believe her training courses will still be available.

The devil is in the detail and thus the Chairs are considering all these issues , people, and financial structures at a meeting on the 09 March.

Conclusions

Service Provision 2021/2 - Take on board the offer of a short term one year "mirror image" service from Trevor Leggo / Mulberry and "friends". The Chair or Clerk will expand upon that after the Chairs review on the 9th.

Ditto 22/23 — Likewise I am pre-empting what will come from the Chair, but I would expect over the forthcoming months a combined Sussex offer to be constructed, discussed with Parishes, and fine-tuned as an offer for future years.

Parish Scrutiny – I believe we all circa 150 parishes and Town Councils need to understand the responsibilities and accountabilities of the corporate structure, particularly their representatives at meetings. Outside of their corporate responsibilities and the AGM, the board, within prescribed parameters should report back on it activities and receive a feedback on the services provided. Not once but a regular Loop.

One Ex-Prime Minister said 20 years ago — Communication , Communication , Communication
